## RAFT: One Business's Junk is a Teacher's Treasure


RAFT (Resource Area For Teaching) provides 7,000 local teachers and community groups with creative tools and materials to promote hands-on learning in science, math, technology, and art.

Over 1,000 local businesses donate everything from office supplies and manufacturing byproducts to used computers and office furniture. Butch Coyne, Marketing Director for RAFT, encourages business to look at items they would normally throw out as potential resources for teachers.

"Just think, an old CD with a balloon attached creates a hovercraft or some Mylar, cardboard tubes, and colorful bits of textile materials can make a kaleidoscope. With projects like these, students and teachers can learn through reuse," he says.
